Our Parents As Teachers program serves expecting families and families with children up to 5 years old at no cost to them. Using a relationship-based approach, we customize learning experiences for each family and child.

Ready Kindergartener

We base each of our programs on a central goal: to ensure young children enter kindergarten physically, cognitively, socially, and emotionally prepared to learn. Early care & education

We support the child care and early education workforce by providing training and consultation free of charge, striving together to improve the quality of early education. In addition to trainings in best practices, we work with them to engage more with families, and remove barriers that prevent young children from loving to learn—positioning them to successfully transition up through all phases of their education. We also seek to raise child care quality by advocating for equitable compensation, benefits, and award programs that reward the value that outstanding early educators bring to the lives of young children.

Children's health

We work with child health, welfare, and early childhood developmental partners to deepen health equity by increasing health literacy and providing individual referrals. We also work together to support mental health by understanding trauma and its impact on children, educators, and families, and by enabling access to affordable, culturally congruent healing modalities. We support all children, especially those with special needs, by understanding brain science and early learning, and advocating for the inclusion of children with disabilities in child care. We also offer development screenings for early identification.



WE OFFER:

- Birthing, childbirth education, and lactation support and referrals
- A bilingual, certified community health worker from PASOs Connections for Child Development
- Monthly Healthy Steps community convenings
- A social inclusion program providing equitable access to child care for children with developmental disabilities
- Support for children with special needs via our equity coaching for caregivers, built on the Pyramid model
- An Emergency Crisis and Immediate Needs Fund
